Message from the Chairman



Welcome to the first issue of our Connect newsletter. As the name would suggest, as a local, community organisation, we are introducing our newsletter as a way to *connect* with not only our PSVCAC community but the broader community in the Port Stephens region.

The year got off to a difficult start, as the Omicron variant of COVID-19 continued to spread and have a huge impact on all of us both at work and at home. The challenges were particularly felt in our residential aged care homes with staff greatly affected, and a large number of staff testing positive to COVID or deemed as close contacts, which put huge pressure on our workforce. We have experienced another outbreak during June at our Harbourside Haven Residential Aged Care Home, so the challenges have certainly continued on into the year. I sincerely thank all of our staff for coming together as a team at such a difficult time and adhering to the strict infection control procedures we have in place. We continue to undertake regular rapid antigen testing of staff prior to the commencement of their shift, together with testing visitors prior to attendance at our homes. I also thank families for their patience when we have been required to restrict visitation on the advice of the Department of Health and the local Public Health Unit.

In March of this year we farewelled our General Manager, Sheree Gemmell. Sheree had been with the company for 14 years in a variety of positions and I thank her for the many hours she contributed to the welfare of our residents and consumers, together with her loyalty and dedication. Following Sheree's departure, the Board commenced recruitment of a Chief Executive Officer, and I am pleased to announce that Suzanne Newton will be commencing in July. On 12 May, as part of International Nurses Day, we celebrated the vital contribution nurses make to our society and organisation and the difference that our nurses and staff make each and every day to the seniors we provide care and support to. Indicative of the sense of community throughout PSVCAC, we had volunteers from our Retirement Living Villages cooking a BBQ for our staff and residents and consumers assisted in making up 'Goodie Boxes' for all team members. The aged care industry as a whole is grappling with the issue of workforce shortages and PSVCAC is not immune to this. As the aged care industry grows in line with the ageing population, it is estimated that the aged care sector workforce will need to increase two or three-fold by 2050. However, currently this demand is not being met. Demographic analysis suggests the workforce problem is exacerbated by both a predominance of older workers and a deficit of younger workers. We continue to work on innovative ways we can attract and retain staff, including the introduction of a range of incentives and a reward and recognition program, and building strong connections with Tomaree Community College, which you can read about on page 3.

I hope you enjoy the first issue of our newsletter and look forward to many more. Our next issue will be released towards the end of 2022.

Enhancing the care of our residents

In recognition of the shortage of doctors able to visit our residential aged care homes, we recently entered into an exciting partnership with 'Health Access', which is a branch of the Rural and Remote Medical Service (RARMS). This virtual medical practice offers weekly onsite face to face clinics and virtual telehealth clinics, with 24-hour on call support to residential aged care facilities who are unable to access local doctors for their residents. It is a great way to provide residents with accessible, responsive and age specific medical care.

Residents who select Health Access as their medical provider are allocated both a general practitioner and a nurse practitioner who work collaboratively to ensure that regular health checks and routine tests are undertaken alongside any clinical needs that arise. Nurse Practitioner Jacqui Culver with Dr Julie Mallinson have been allocated to our facilities, both are passionate about ageing well and optimum clinical care for older people. Future proofing our Workforce

PSVCAC and Tomaree Community College have enjoyed a long-standing partnership, with the College providing training not only to new staff, but also our existing employees, in areas such as nursing, first aid, medication, and home care.

Workplace experience is an important part of the training for new entrant workers to obtain the hands-on experience they need to work in the aged care sector, and that's where this partnership really shines! PSVCAC provide the learning environment that the students from Tomaree Community College require while completing courses such as the Certificate III in Individual Support. This then enables the students to confidently transition to working within PSVCAC's residential homes and community care services if they wish to do so.

Representatives from PSVCAC and Tomaree Community College work closely together to keep up to date with new and innovative ways to engage both organisations to benefit the training supplied. The ultimate goal is to continually reach out to the broader community to take up training which then enables the supply of a dedicated well-trained workforce for PSVCAC. In addition to training staff, another benefit to the partnership has been the ability for the College to run computer courses for residents on site over the years.
